

CLINICAL INSTRUCTOR COURSE

Course Description

The course aims to prepare and develop RNs with the knowledge, skills and attitude for an effective role in clinical supervision and assessment of pre-registration and post-registration nursing students.

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course, the learner will be able to:

- 1. Describe the roles and responsibilities of a clinical instructor in nursing
- 2. Discuss the principles of clinical supervision
- 3. Explore different learning styles and teaching strategies to meet students/learners' needs
- 4. Apply and facilitate reflective learning in practice
- 5. Discuss best practices in assessing and verifying students'/learners' clinical learning and achievement of expected competencies
- 6. Apply assessment methods used by various education institutions to achieve expected learning outcomes
- 7. Provide constructive feedback and encourage improvements
- 8. Apply tools to evaluate clinical learning environment
- 9. Apply best practices in communication skills with students, colleagues and other healthcare staff
- 10. Conduct clinical supervision of a group of students/learners
- 11. Manage common student/learner learning issues

Target Audience

Registered nurses working in the clinical setting with a minimum of 3 years' clinical experience and a minimum of 1 year as a clinical preceptor; preferably possess an advanced diploma or post graduate diploma in nursing/equivalent for specialty areas.
